Advance Directives	
Living Will	<i>A declaration which directs physicians to withhold or withdraw life-sustaining treatment which only goes into effect if the patient is unable to communicate end of life care treatment wishes.</i>
Durable Power of Attorney	<i>A signed, dated and witnessed document naming another person as an agent or proxy to make medical decisions for you if you should become unable to make them for yourself.</i>
POLST (Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment)	<i>A form which is completed by the physician after a discussion is held with a patient with an advanced life-limiting illness, translating the end of life care treatment wishes of the patient into actual physician orders.</i>
